



FORESTRY INDUSTRY

The forestry industry offers a wide range of roles and career paths.

Forester: Foresters undertake a whole-of-landscape approach to land management and are often involved in tasks that assist to minimise or mitigate soil erosion, conserve water catchment values and provide suitable habitats for native fauna and flora. Foresters engage with farmers, engineers, water supply and soil conservation officers, ecologists and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to actively manage and protect our forests.

Cultivator: As a cultivator in the forest growing and management sector you would be part of an industry that produces sustainably sourced wood for many applications that use this wonderful renewable resource. A range of regular tasks would include collecting and propagating seeds, pruning and fertilising trees, controlling weeds and pests and planning planting cycles.

Carbon Storage Specialist: As a Carbon Storage Specialist you will be familiar with carbon markets, carbon standards and also have experience in forestry management techniques. This may include GIS and remote sensing analyst software and biomass inventories. A range of regular tasks would include recording field data, modelling sequestration and drafting reports.
